Ringing Masters Report 2006/2007

This year we have rung for several major occasions including Remembrance Sunday, Christmas and some towers 'rang in' the new year. April saw the Queens 80th birthday for which several towers rang quarter peals and almost all towers managed to raise a band. 13 quarter peals were rung by 10 towers for Quarter Peal Week in November

A number of our members went to Oxford for the 125 anniversary Festival of the Oxford Diocesan Guild. Despite the long queues for each tower (especially the Cathedral), most people seemed to enjoy the day.

Around 20 ringers from all over the Sonning Deanery came on the branch outing to Surrey in February. We rang at 6 towers and enjoyed a pub lunch. Many thanks the Rachel Moss for organising such a great day! Hopefully this will become an annual event.

Four teams entered the 6 bell striking competition in April with Sonning winning the trophy. Woking All Saints won the 8 bell competition with a very impressive course of Yorkshire S. Major.

Branch practices have been variable this year. We have rung a wide variety of methods at most practices. The least popular practices were those held after striking comps, so perhaps this needs to be taken in to consideration next year. The most popular were those with other events especially the practice at Arborfield where we enjoyed a picnic and a game of giant Jenga. The branch day time practices at Wokingham all saints continue to be successful, we generally ring Stedman, Single Oxford Bob Minor and something unusual which makes for an interesting and challenging practice.

76 quarter peals have been run this year with 3 firsts, 23 first in method and 7 other landmarks reached. 4 peals were rung including Lincolnshire S. Major. to celebrate the wedding of Judith Burbidge and Jonathan Bowler at East-hampstead.

I know of new recruits at Arborfield, Binfield, Easthampstead, White Waltham and Wokingham All Saints - there may be more! Binfield have 6 new starters following a successful recruitment campaign and perhaps we can all learn from them. Despite these recruits many towers are struggling to keep going. Hurst have given up regular practices and are attempting 1 quarter peal each month. We need to consider how to recruit and retain ringers, and how to develop sound ringing in all our towers if bell ringing is to survive in the Sonning deanery.

As others see us

'Oh would some power the giftie gie us, to see ourselves as others see us'. When Robert Burns wrote these famous lines in his poem to a louse, I am sure he was not thinking about bellringers. A web search on the quotation, shows many religious and philosophical articles about the value of being able to see ourselves in a detached way. Obviously there is merit in seeing ourselves from the outside.

My reason for quoting it here is a remark at November's daytime practice, when we were discussing Branch training courses. "Maybe people don't know what they would get out of a course called 'See yourself handling on video'".

So here is an explanation of that one, and also some of the others that you might not be quite sure about. I assume that ones like *Elementary bob calling* or *Raising and lowering in peal* are self explanatory.

See yourself ringing on video – While ringing, it is virtually impossible to observe yourself. Your eyes are in the wrong place, and anyway, your mind is concentrating on what you are doing. The video camera lets you focus on your ringing, and then afterwards view yourself from different angles, to see what your hands, arms, rope, etc were really doing. And you can always you replay it if didn't quite see the first time. If you have perfect handling, and can control the most difficult bell or rope with ease, then all you are likely to get from the experience is a sense of novelty and satisfaction, but if you are a real ringer, even a good one, you would almost certainly learn something of interest. The course is mainly aimed at ringers who already know that some bells (or even all bells) give them a problem, but they don't know why. Even if someone has told them 'what they are doing wrong' they either don't know why, or how to do anything about it. In such case, being able to see what really happens, and to discuss it with someone experienced, can be very helpful. Once you understand what is happening, then it is much easier to do something about it.

- Listening skills Many ringers find it hard to hear their bell, and use it to help their striking. Being told to 'listen to it' doesn't help, and they might be tempted to give up trying. This course includes practical exercises in listening that anyone can manage. The difficulty is controlled, you are not stressed by having to control a bell at the same time, and you can take your time. In addition, you get feedback on whether you got it right, and you can repeat the exercise if you need to. Given the right conditions, you might find you can hear more than your thought. In any case, it is a very useful first step to listening more effectively while ringing.
- **Ring with a simulator** This takes you a step beyond the listening course. The simulator rings all bells but yours perfectly, a luxury you don't often get with real ringers, so you have the ideal environment for ringing rhythmically, hearing your own bell, and using it to control your striking. Because there are no other ropes, you have to rely on rhythm and listening, which are essential skills for good striking. Once you get used to it, you are likely to find you are better than you thought. The ringing is deliberately simple (e.g. Rounds) so you don't need rope sight to correct method mistakes.
